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The Panama Canal is an artificial 77 km water way in Panama that connects the Atlantic Ocean and the Pacific Ocean. The canal cut across Panama is a key route for international maritime trade.

Around three million years ago, a narrow strip of earth emerged from the sea due to volcanic movement of land mass. This strip of land separated the waters of the Atlantic and the Pacific oceans and connected the continents of North and South Americas. It is today known as the Republic of Panama, an independent nation since the year 1903.

The need to connect the two oceans by a water way across Panama was felt as early as in 1500s to cut short the sea route from Europe to Eastern Asia. France was ultimately the first country to attempt the task on 1st January, 1880. Led by Count Ferdinand de Lesseps, the promoter of the suez canal, a French construction company started the work of digging the Panama Canal. Although the Panama Canal is only 40% as long as the suez canal, the former proved to be a difficult challenge, due to the tropical rain forests alive with venomous snakes, insects and spiders. But the worst problem was the yellow fever and malaria which killed thousands of workers. The French soon realised how difficult it was to work through tropical rain forests, in incessant rains and through mountains with sliding rocks. Soon the French company ran out of funds with less than half of the project completed. The task was ultimately taken over by the USA and it took ten years to complete the Panama Canal.

The first ship passed through the canal in 1914. With this developments ships could sail directly between the Atlantic and the Pacific oceans. Without going all the way around the southern tip of South America. The American Society of Civil Engineer named the Panama Canal as one of the wonders of the modern world.

Charlie Chaplin grew up wandering about the streets of London, often sleeping outdoor at night. He tried all kinds of work.

However his desire to be an actor remained firm and unwavering. He would say, 'There is no rain that lasts forever'. He often recollected what his mother had taught him. Chaplin mother taught him that there was no shame in being poor, but the spiritual poverty and greed made life disgraceful.

As a child Chaplin was once confined to bed for several weeks. At night his mother would sit near the window and act out what was happening outside. Thus his mother initiated him to be an actor. His undanted desire to be an actor led him to his successful career as a comic actor in the film industry. But his films delivered the serious message of of liberty, brotherhood and equality.
